And his commandments are not burdensome. ⁴ For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. * THE NICENE CREED







* WORDS OF INSTITUTION

P You are indeed holy, almighty and merciful God; you are most holy, and great is the majesty of your glory.
You so loved the world that you gave your only Son, that whoever believes in him may not perish but have eternal life.
Having come into the world, he fulfilled for us your holy will and accomplished our salvation.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.




THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE SACRAMENT


