Each lady will order from the menu, and be responsible for the cost.


Why not join us for a pleasant and enjoyable time, in fellowship and relaxation.

## FROM THE PASTOR

By now you've probably noticed that I have usually included a portrait from German Renaissance painter Albrecht Dürer (21 May 1471 - 6 April 1528) in many of my newsletter articles. I first was introduced to Dürer's works when my grandmother Elizabeth took me to Dürer's and her hometown of Nuremberg,

Germany as a young man. To this day in Nuremberg, Dürer is still one of the great figures of that historical and beautiful city. His house is still there and may be toured and his portraits and sculptures are seen throughout the city. Dürer was about ten years older than Martin Luther and he grew to become a great supporter of Luther and Luther's efforts to reform the Church. Due to his outsized influence among Nuremberg's leading citizens, Nuremberg became one of the centers of the early Lutheran Church, all the while being surrounded by often hostile Roman Catholic lands in nearby Bavaria. It's with all of this in mind that I want you to take a look at this 1513 portrait by Dürer entitled "Knight, Death and the Devil" (Auf Deutsch: Ritter, Tod und Teufel).

Look at the knight. Dürer by all accounts used an actual knight from 1513 as his model. The gear, weapons and armor are all contemporary to Dürer's time. Now look at the knight's gaze. It is forward, full of courage and determination. This is important because to his side is death on a horse (Revelation 6:8). In death's rotting hand is an hourglass. The hourglass says, "your time is short, I am coming for you." Death is ugly, but not as ugly as the figure slightly behind the knight. This is the devil, the father of lies (St. John 8:44). He seeks the knight's soul. Both death and the devil surround the knight. Below the knight is his faithful and trusty steed and dog. Both are moving forward through the valley of the shadow of death (Psalm 23). What is the knight focused upon? It is Christ and his Kingdom (Hebrews 12:2). Notice up on the hill in the background is the fortress. This is home. This is where Christ leads. Home where "He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away. (Revelation 21:4)."



Friends, this is not a portrait of some random knight from the 16th century, but rather it is portrait of each one of you and our entire church. We are moving through the valley of the shadow of death and we will not be deterred. We will not be afraid. Why? We are constantly focused upon Christ our savior all the way. He leads, we follow. All around us death and the devil stalk reminding us of our mortality and how much we have sinned. Look to your saviour Jesus. Tell that devil who roams around that you belong to Jesus Christ. He has claimed you and made you his own. When the devil throws your sins up into your face say what Luther taught you, "What of it?! I know Jesus Christ and he knows me. On his account, I am forgiven

and free." That devil will run at the very name of Jesus, the Lion of Judah (Revelation 5:5). When death frightens you, when it tears a gaping hole in your heart as it will inevitably do, remember this: Christ is risen and has conquered death. He gets the last word. Say it to yourself again and again, "Christ is risen. Christ is alive and he will not let me go. This he promises to me (Romans 8)."

Christians you are the knight. Put on the armor of Christ and move forward after him. Do not be afraid. Do not lose focus. Stay vigilant. Stand firm in the faith of the Apostles. Do not give into the ways of the world, the devil or your flesh.

Sunday, 29 May 2022
