THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE SACRAMENT



We are making plans to take a Salem Church trip to Germany 10-17 March 2025. We will be flying from Philadelphia to Berlin, Germany direct. Highlights include: Berlin (Berlin Cathedral-perhaps the most beautiful Lutheran Church in the world and plenty of free time to explore); Lutherstadt Wittenberg (Martin Luther's hometown); Eisleben (where Luther was born and died), Leipzig (where the Heinrich Muhlenberg the patriarch of Pennsylvania Lutherans was ordained and Bach was organist); Dresden (the beautiful Frauenkirche, a Baroque Lutheran masterpiece rebuilt in 2005); Erfurt (my favorite city in Germany where Luther went to university and became an Augustian Friar); Weimar and Eisenach (where Bach was born and Luther went to elementary school); Wartburg Castle (where St. Elizabeth lived and where Luther translated the New Testament into the German). Finally, Rüdesheim (where some of the finest wine in the world is cultivated).
